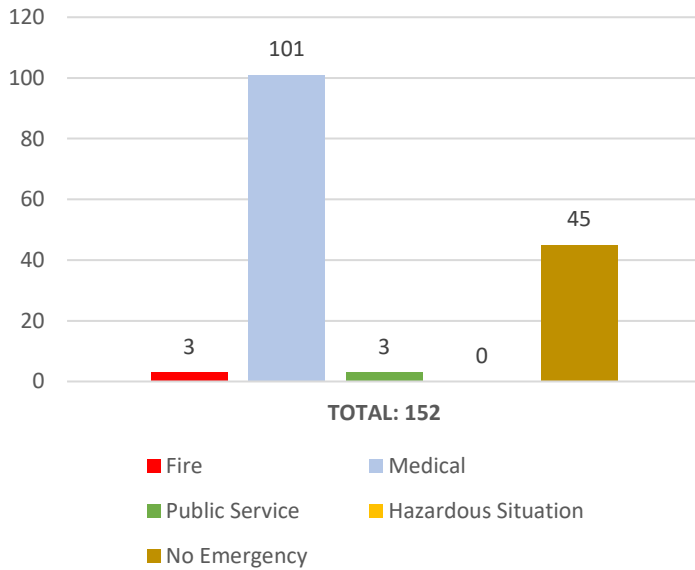




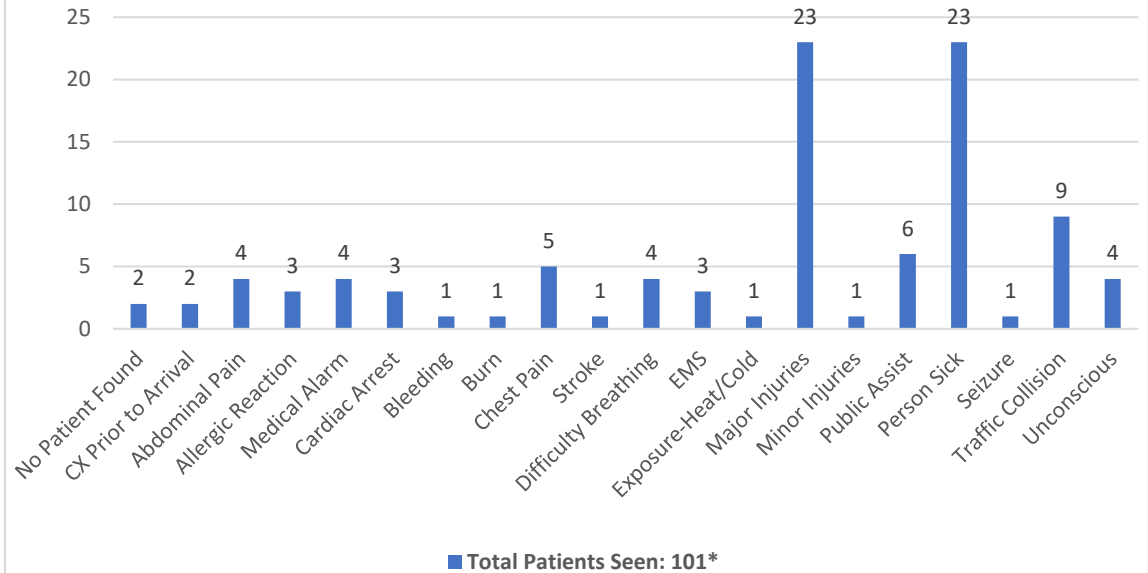

PATIENTS SEEN

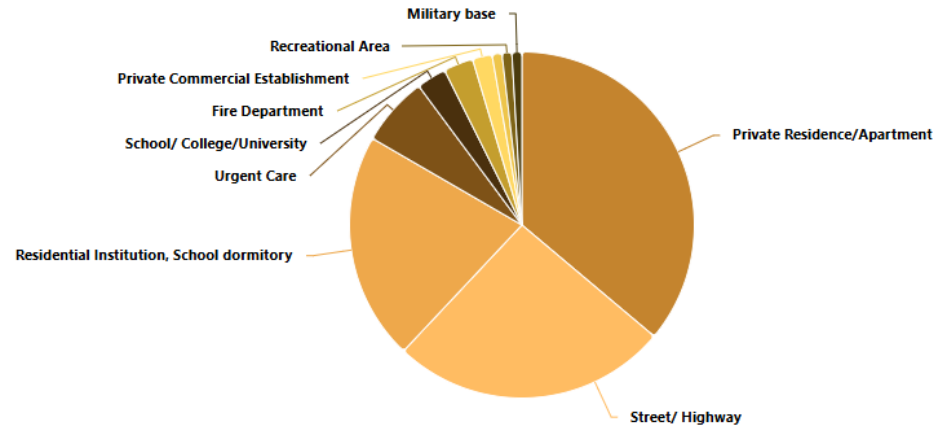

NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

8/3/26	Vehicle Fire	5769 Summit Crest Drive	
8/21/26	Vehicle Fire	Westbound 210 east of Angeles Crest Highway	Semi truck/trailer hauling hay well involved with fire; hay bales loaded too close to exhaust, causing ignition. Approx. 75% of the hay bales were burned.
8/21/26	Fire, other	4285 Mesa Vista Drive	Smoldering insulation on a trailer.

NOTEWORTHY TRAFFIC COLLISIONS

8/3/26	Angeles Crest Highway / Bay Tree Road	TC involving Bus – a bus was cut off and swerved into a block wall. No injuries reported to bus passengers, except some minor glass shards landing on some. CHP escorted bus down the hill to a parking lot for passengers to transfer to a new bus.
8/5/26	Angeles Crest Highway / Mile Marker 26-50	TC Over the Side – Assisted Pasadena Fire with one patient who was actually a bystander rescuer to the vehicle over the side incident who injured his knee when he stepped into a hole. Pasadena Fire handled the over the side incident.

Note: Where two streets are listed, the first street is the street on which the collision occurred; the second street is the closest cross-street. Th two streets listed do not necessarily mean the collision occurred in the intersection.

SAFETY TIP OF THE MONTH:

It only takes a few seconds for a child to drown. Drowning accidents are a leading cause of death for children under four years old. Tips to keep you and your family safe:

- Never take your eyes off a child when he/she is in or near any body of water.
- Don't rely on barriers, such as fences or walls, near a pool or spa. Constant supervision is essential.
- Remove toys and ensure your pool is covered when not in use.
- Don't rely on inflatable devices to keep your child afloat and keep a life ring accessible.
- Learn CPR and rescue breathing.
